# Continuing Our Legacy

Here at TCH, 2017 was truly defined by our 108-year tradition of serving as a **Welcoming Home**.

This was, and continues to be, reflected in our clients’ successes, our connections to the community, and in the hearts of the many individuals who support our mission. 2017 was a very busy year!

Our four core programs adapted and grew to meet the needs of our community:

In **Education**, English language and GED classes now use Chrome-books which allow students to complete homework assignments using Google Classroom on the “Cloud.” Talk Time is now held weekly and connects volunteers with students in order to practice conversational English.

**Employment** now offers Certified Nursing Assistant training in partnership with Tacoma Community College, computer programming classes, monthly job fairs, and employment placement assistance.

**Immigration Services** served more people than ever, including our DREAMers seeking help renewing their DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals) documents. TCH partnered with OneAmerica on Citizenship Day to provide free attorney consultations with individual citizenship applications.

**Crime Victim Advocacy** added a therapy group for parents of child sexual assault victims—a much needed service that is having wonderful results.

At TCH, we have the honor of celebrating the accomplishments of those we serve every day. In 2017, because of your generosity, we were able to do so in many meaningful and empowering ways. Record numbers of you stepped forward to provide financial, in-kind and volunteer support.

Hosted community **Movie Nights** and “**Trunk-or-Treat**.” ▶



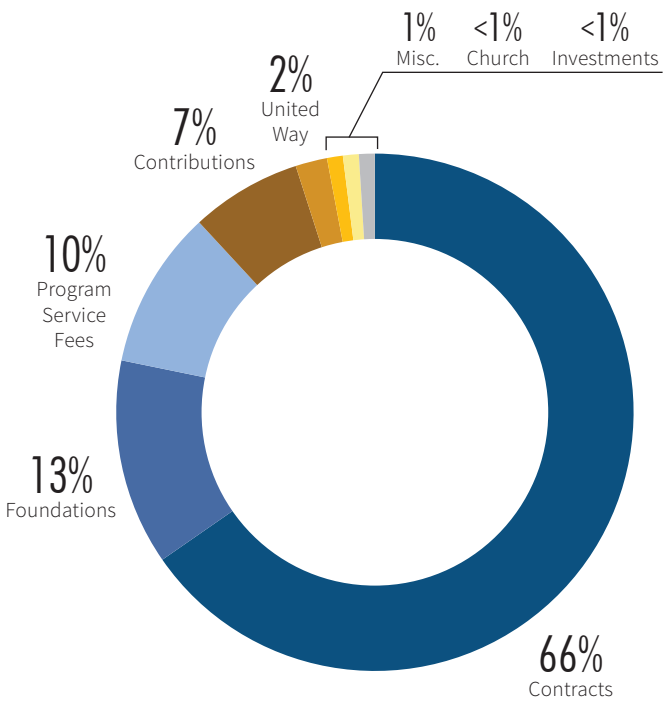

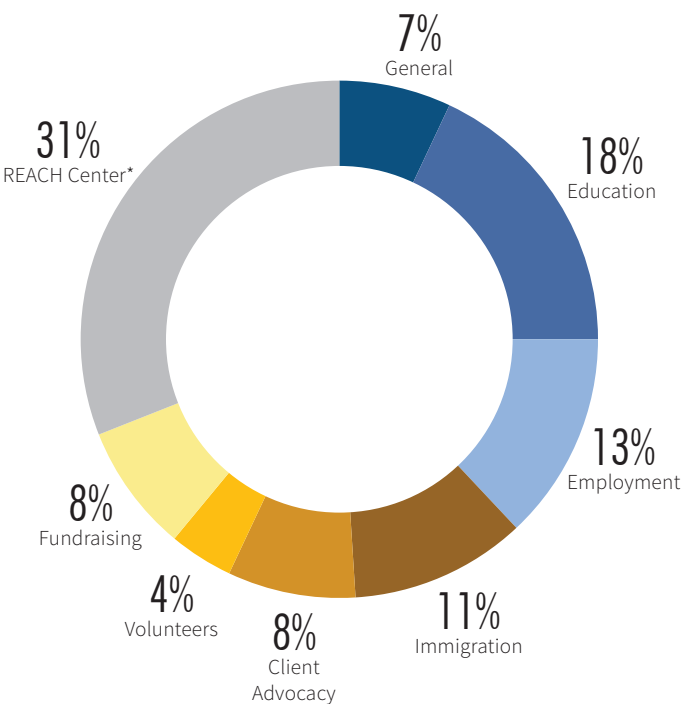

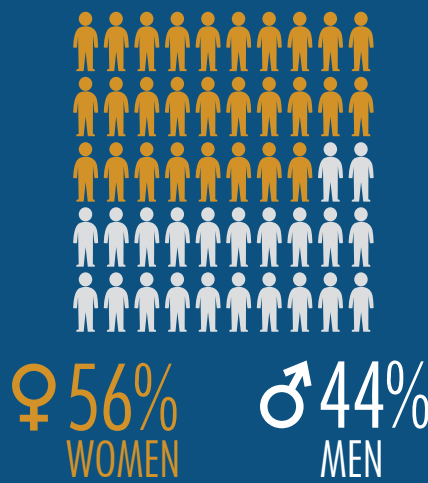
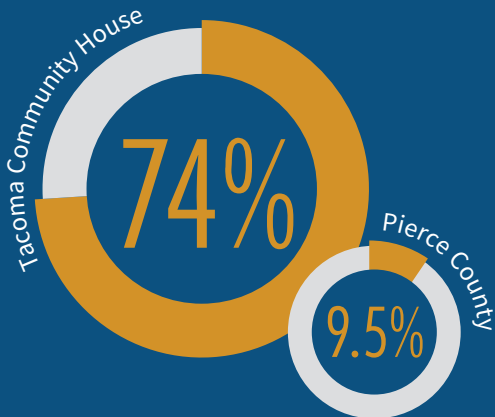

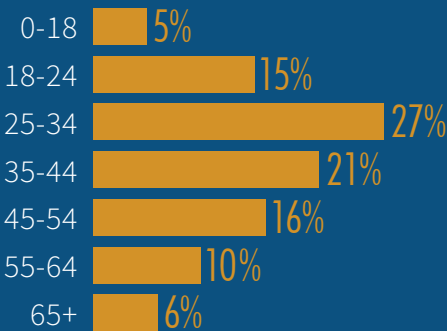

**% BORN OUTSIDE OF THE U.S. (IMMIGRANTS AND REFUGEES)**



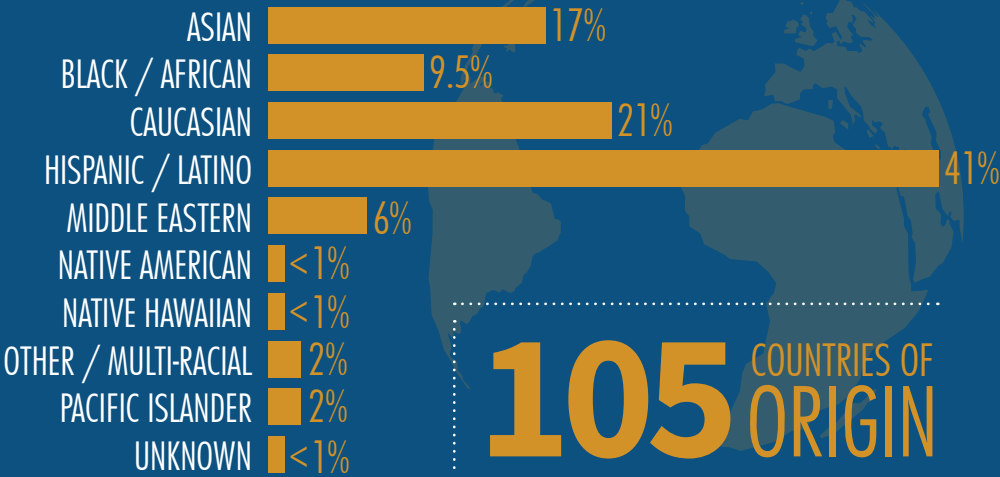

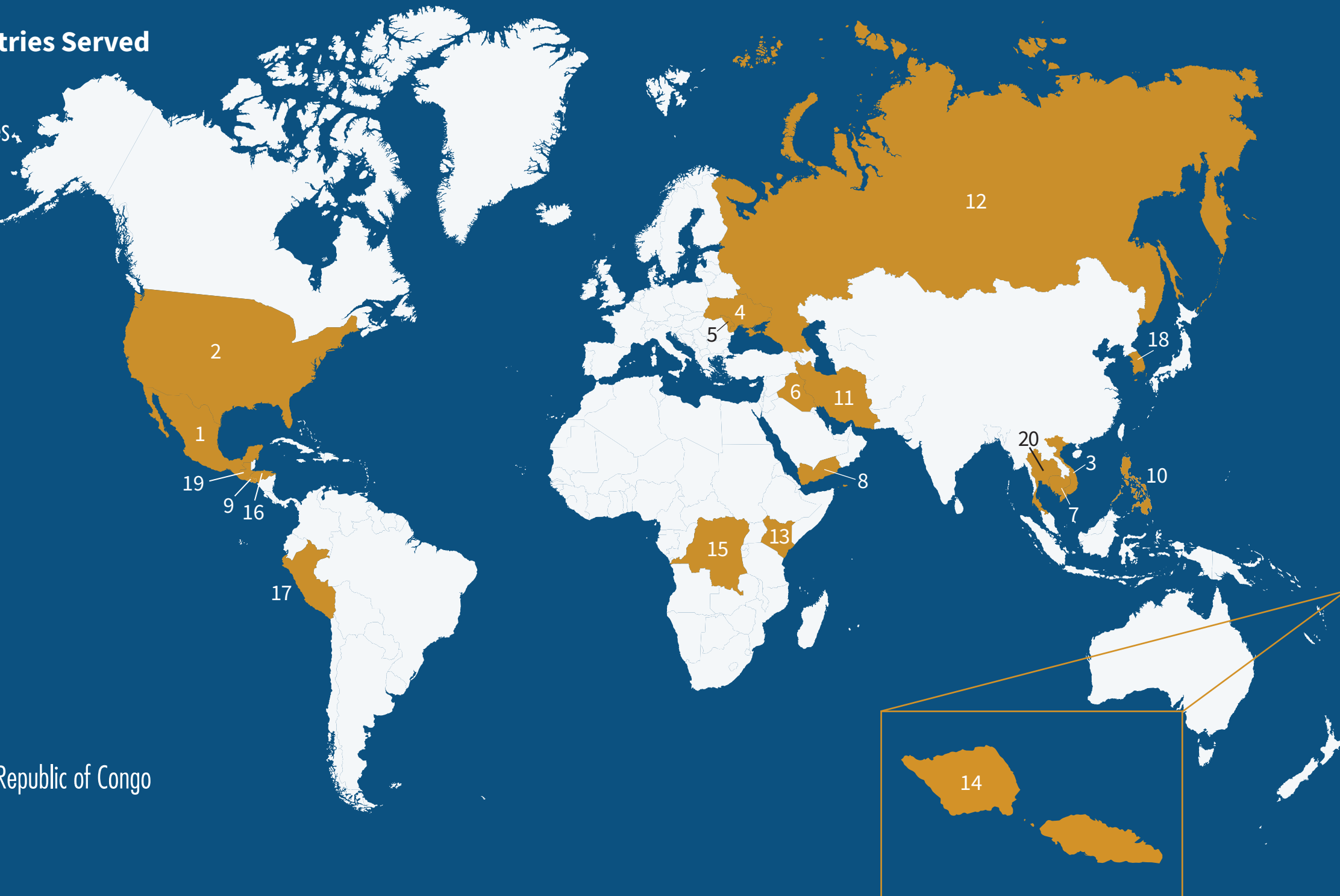

## Meet Wadhah and Najla

In 2013, Wadhah and Najla Al-Shargabi narrowly escaped death when militants bombed their house and family printing business in southern Yemen.

Homeless, jobless, and with two young sons, they relied on family members to survive amidst a backdrop of violent civil war. "You can't imagine how bad it was," 32-year-old Wadhah says.

Najla, then pregnant, decided to make the 8,200-mile journey to the U.S. to give birth to her third child in safety. Najla is a naturalized U.S. citizen, but her husband and sons were not. Agonizingly, she knew she had to leave them behind.

Najla landed in Washington and turned to Tacoma Community House to see if anyone could help reunite her family. There she connected with Mari Stiffler, an Immigration Specialist with over a decade of experience.

It took three long years, but through Najla and Mari's tireless work, Wadhah and their sons were granted visas (as the spouse and children of a U.S. citizen) and could become Legal Permanent Residents.

When Wadhah arrived, it was difficult adjusting and he was nervous speaking English. Washington's Department of Social and Human

Services referred Wadhah to TCH, where he began taking English Language classes and working with an Employment Case Manager. As he gained practical fluency and landed a job with Auto Warehousing Co., his anxiety lessened. He loved his teachers, case workers, and classmates. "I'm very sad," he says of leaving TCH, "They are my family.. all of them."

Wadhah will always hold Yemen in his heart, but now looks forward to applying for U.S. citizenship — a process he can begin next year. In the U.S. he says, "everybody smiles. It's like when you go to Paradise."

Once a citizen, he hopes to petition for his parents to join him so they don't have to miss another precious moment of their grandchildren's lives. He also wants to start his own business, a printing press company.

"I can do a lot here," he says. "I know I can do it. Once you catch the opportunity, everything is possible."

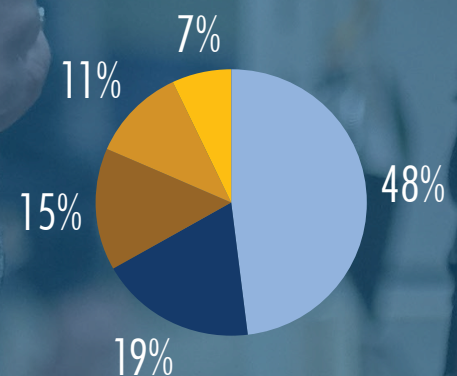

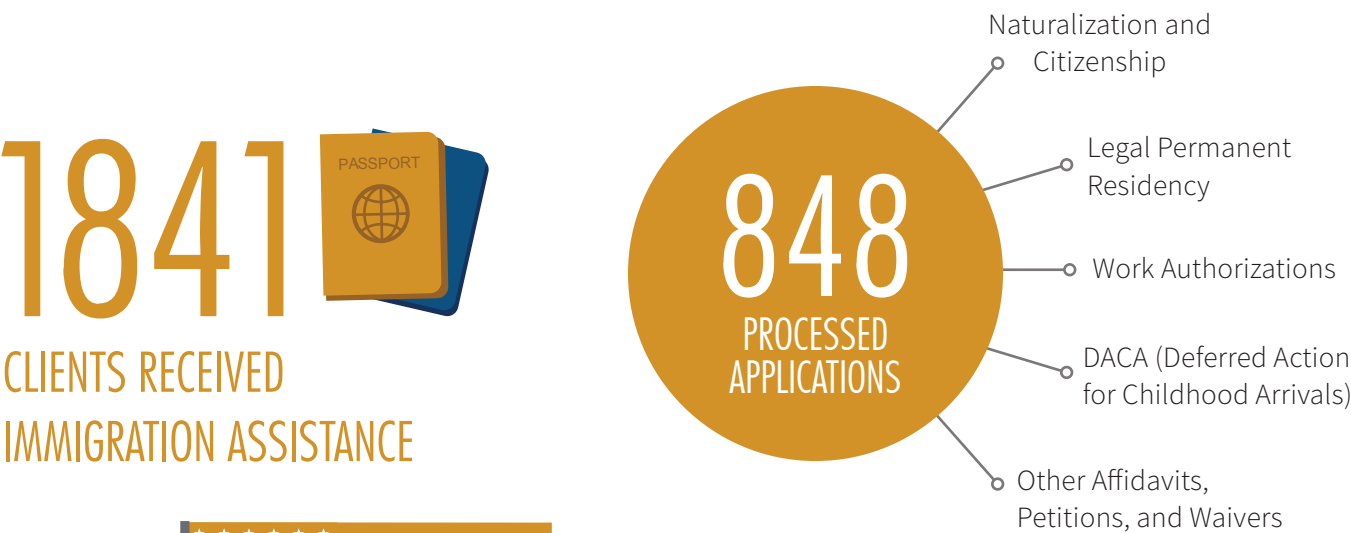

# Immigration

TCH is recognized by the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Legal Access Programs, providing assurance of our staff’s experience and training in the area of immigration law. Because of our accredited case managers and funding support, **TCH is able to provide immigration services for free or at a fraction of the cost of an attorney — removing a significant barrier for those we serve.**

In 2017, TCH continued the important work of helping a record number of individuals navigate complex immigration laws and applications.



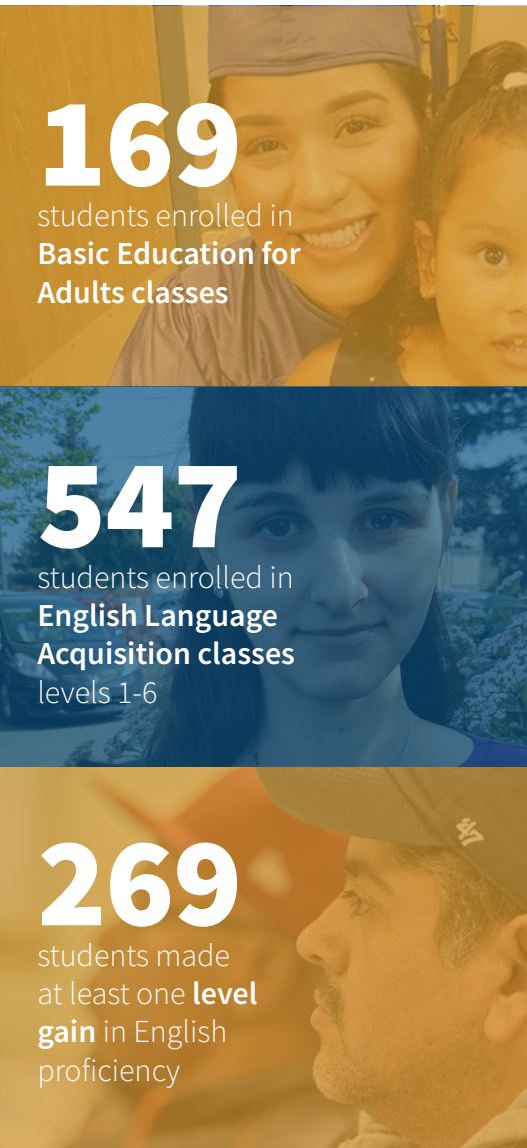

# Education

Imagine that you move to a country where you do not speak the language — let alone recognize any of the letters of the alphabet — and you have six to nine months to learn enough of that language to get a job. Now imagine that you have only ten to twelve hours a week to accomplish that goal. Our students face a daunting challenge, but they come to school ready and anxious to learn.

At TCH, we use total English immersion, as one classroom of 25 students can represent over ten different first languages. **Our teachers cover reading, listening, speaking and writing and — for some — the idea of simply what it means to study.** Teachers use English any way they can — with pictures, actions, technology, software, and audio aids.

Many are now even using classroom sets of Chromebooks to learn collaboratively with other students in new and exciting ways, with the important side benefit of improving their technology skills.

Our client advocates help victims of crime **navigate legal processes** and **regain a sense of safety**. Crimes experienced by TCH clients include: domestic violence and assault, sexual assault/rape, child sexual assault/abuse, homicide and attempted homicide, robbery, vehicular assault, hate crimes, fraud, kidnapping, exploitation, elder abuse, and human trafficking.

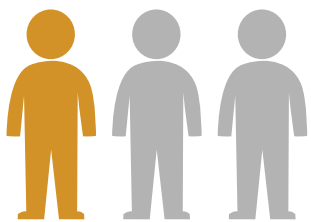
# Read2Me

Reading proficiency by the time a student enters the 4th grade is one of the most important predictors of high school graduation and career success and the statistics are alarming: **Only a third of America’s 4th graders are proficient grade-level readers or better.** This is the critical issue Read2Me seeks to improve — with a personalized, one-on-one approach.

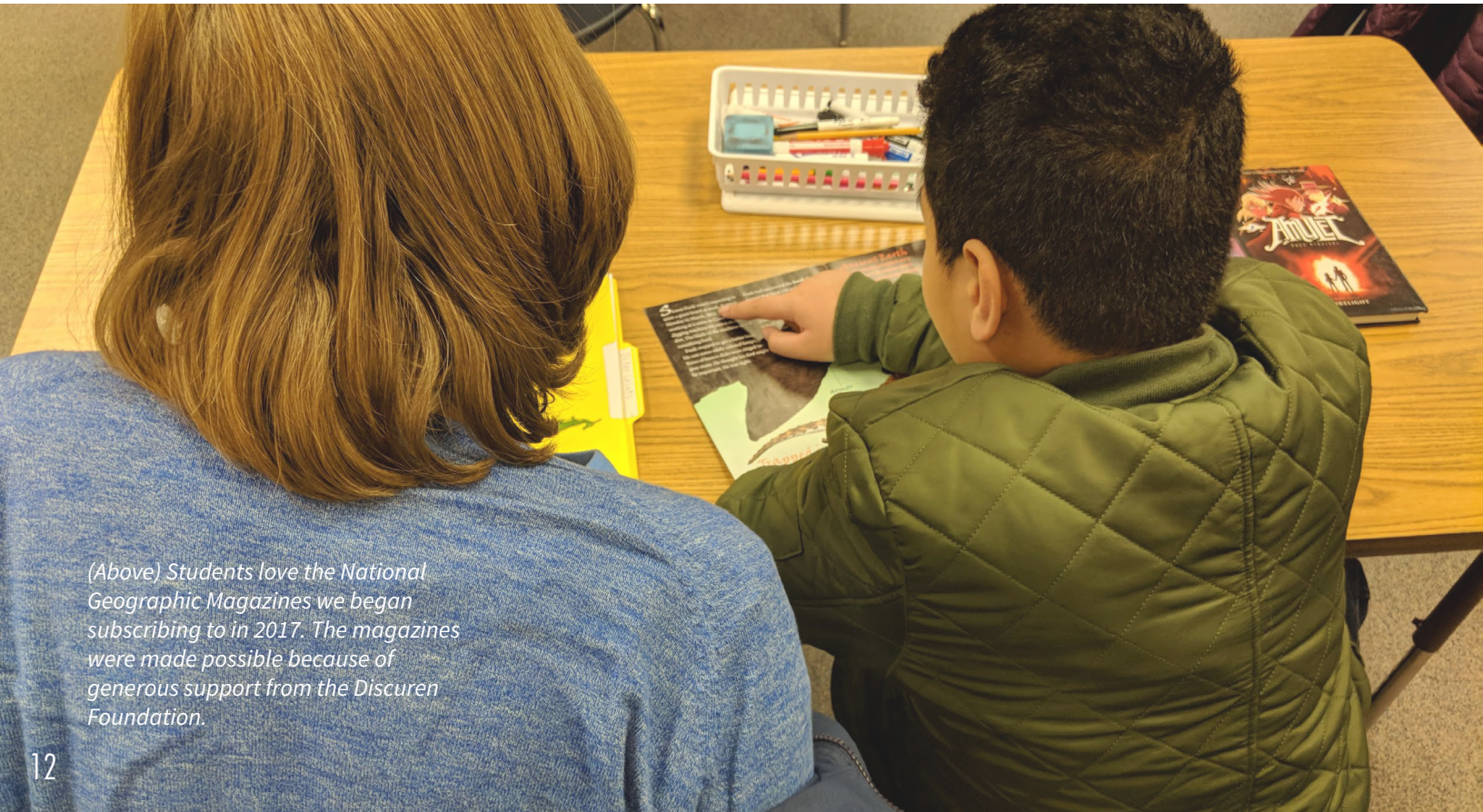
**435** students were served at McCarver, Arlington, Manitou Park, and Lister elementary schools

**180** dedicated volunteers donated **3,912** hours to Read2Me students.

The value of a student meeting with the same volunteer tutor each week has been a major factor in the success of Read2Me, and the social-emotional aspect of Read2Me is consistent with furthering the school district’s focus on addressing social-emotional factors affecting student learning.

Tacoma Community House is the fiscal sponsor of **The REACH Center**, a one-stop youth service center for young people 16-24 seeking to advance their educational, career, and life goals.

At no point in recent history have TCH's programs and services for immigrants and refugees been more in demand or more needed. In order to meet this demand, TCH has embarked upon ***Embracing the American Promise: Uniting Communities Campaign***, a \$13.3 million initiative to construct a new 27, 000 sq. ft., two-story building. TCH plans to break ground in the fall of 2018. A new facility will give TCH the capacity to:

- **Increase the number of classrooms** to ultimately serve 300 more students each year.
- Provide a **student lounge and study spaces**.
- Create and increase the number of **confidential client spaces** for sensitive interviews, allowing TCH to serve nearly 700 more clients receiving immigration and crime victim services annually.
- Provide **new spaces for employment workshops, job fairs and additional job placement services**, allowing TCH to serve 670 more participants each year in employment services.
- **Provide space for additional staff** in all departments to serve more people.
- Offer much-needed **neighborhood and community spaces** for meetings, social events, and other educational activities, serving an anticipated 500+ residents annually.
